Isaiah was a prophet – he shared messages from God with God’s people, sometimes even sharing God’s promises for the future. Isaiah wrote that God would send Jesus, the rescuer, to bring justice and share God’s love. Isaiah tells us Jesus will be like God’s servant because he will do what God has called him to do. God has plans for us too and we can serve God in lots of different ways.

One way is about working for justice. That means seeing situations where things are not right or are unfair and doing what we can, either to make those situations right or to make people more aware of them.
