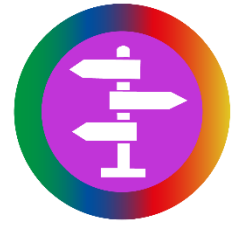




Luke 10: 30-37 The Good Samaritan

Draw four coloured hearts on the square pockets, write numbers on the inner triangles and under each flap write something kind you might do.

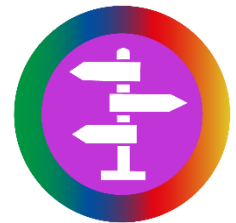

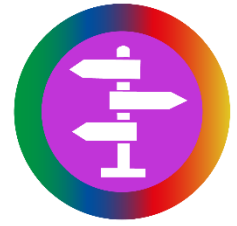

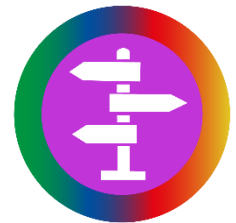
